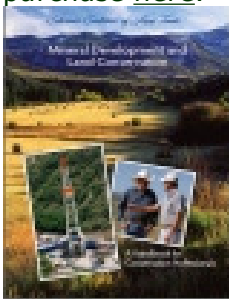

Gold Belt Byway and Palmer Land Trust Conservation Tour

A tour which focused on land protection efforts in Teller County was held on August 20th. This scenic tour focused on three working ranches that the conservation efforts of the byway and land trusts have helped protect.

Broken Wagon Ranch is a 1300 acre property that is protected under a conservation easement which was donated to the Palmer Land Trust in 1992. This working ranch has been in the same family for the past 50 years.

The owners of the Stone Ranch were some of the first to place a conservation easement on their property in the area which has since served as a catalyst for others to do the same. This 375 acre property was conserved in 2006 with the support of Great Outdoors Colorado and Natural Resources Conservation Service.

Green Ranch was the third stop on this scenic tour. The Colorado Cattlemen's Agricultural Land Trust has partnered with the family to protect the ranch and its important agricultural, historic, and other conservation values.
